- Look for Warning Signs Often, but not always, people considering suicide will exhibit warning signs. These can include talking about killing themselves, expressing feelings of hopelessness, feeling like a burden to others, isolating from family and friends, withdrawing from activities, and giving away prized possessions. - Ask Directly Be direct; don't avoid using the word suicide. It can be an uncomfortable question. It might help to tell your friend why you're asking. Say something like, "I've noticed you've been talking a lot about wishing you were dead. Are you thinking about killing yourself?" or "I saw that you gave away your skateboard, and you've seemed depressed lately. Have you been thinking about suicide?" Be prepared for their answer. Stay calm and listen without judgment.
- Tell a Trusted Adult Now is not the time to keep a secret for a friend. Tell an adult you trust as soon as possible. You can also turn to the resources listed to the left for 24/7 help.
