## Youth Prevention Education Evidence-Based Model Program Overview

**REQUIREMENTS:** Booster sessions must be implemented in the subsequent grade level of the core curriculum. ALL program staff must be trained in the curriculum they are implementing within one year and must use the most updated program curriculum. Providers must also purchase all copyrighted student materials from the developer (it is a copyright violation to copy the materials without developer permission).

**OPIOID LESSON REQUIREMENT:** In coordination with the delivery of the evidence-based curriculum cycles, deliver an approved additional session(s) addressing opioids. Curriculums that do not have an IDHS-approved opioid lesson must use one of the approved lessons found under the Youth Prevention Education section of the <u>Substance Use Prevention Strategy Resources</u> on the Prevention First Website.
