FY24 Safe Storage Initiative Process Evaluation Report



The Let's Talk Cannabis Safe Storage initiative addressed increased accidental edible poisoning among children under 11 in Illinois. The initiative aimed to provide a lockable container and information about safer storage solutions for cannabis edibles to parents and caregivers.





Partners helped distribute locking, LTC-branded stash bags to **parents** or caregivers who have young children and cannabis at home. Each bag featured a QR code to the <u>Let's Talk Cannabis website</u>. Partners also received English/Spanish locking instructions and promotional signage.

Bags were distributed before the 4/20 holiday, when cannabis edible consumption was likely to increase, and before the summer, when children were more likely to be home.


